At Nelson Mandela University we offer study abroad students the opportunity to make a difference in communities where assistance is much needed.

Students can volunteer through our service-learning initiatives by assisting at one of our approved community-service learning projects.

This service learning is offered as a credit bearing module where students can obtain 8 NMU credits (2 USA credits / 4 ECTS credits) for volunteering 2 hours per week, attending community service-learning workshops and submitting a journal and visual presentation on their experiences at the projects.

Students can apply for community service learning during registration.

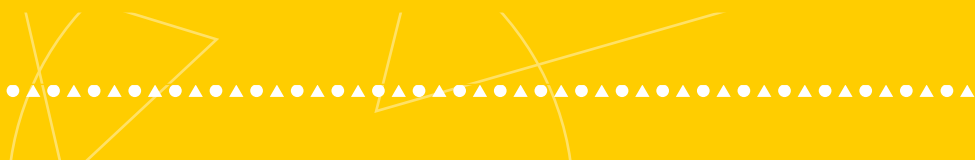
